At Canton Local, our Department of Nutrition Services is committed to providing our students with a well-balanced, nutritious meal that they will enjoy, while following health and safety requirements for schools to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Where Will Students Eat

Students will eat lunch in the classrooms. Teachers will clean and sanitize student desks/tabletops prior to taking their students to the cafeteria to pick up lunch. Students will be divided into three lines to ensure social distancing is being practiced. All students will have the same options to choose from in each line. Teachers will then take their students back to the classroom to eat their lunch. All students will wash/sanitize their hands before consuming and after consuming food.

Meal Service

For the students purchasing lunch, there will be three lines with the same meal options. Each line will have one prescribed flow of traffic to the service area, the cashier, and out back into the cafeteria. The lines will be marked to ensure students can social distance while waiting in line. All students must use the sanitation table at the point of entry to the service area. All self-serve stations will be eliminated and all meals will be served to students from a properly trained Nutrition Service staff member. If items are set out for students to grab they will all be packaged, pre-wrapped, or in sealed containers. All condiments packets, and sealed plasticware will be near the cashiers for students to select.

Check Out

On the way out before a student exits the line, they will cleanse their finger with rubbing alcohol wipes and/or sanitizer and then scan their finger at the point of sale. Student lunch money must be given to homeroom teachers at the beginning of the school day to be sent down in bank bags to the cafeteria, or parents can use payschoolscentral.com to load money.

Clean Up

When the lunch period is complete, paraprofessionals and/or students and/or teachers will then disinfect each table before resuming instruction time

Breakfast

Grab and Go breakfast stations will be available in the main hallways. There will be a breakfast cart with grab and go breakfast bags for students to grab. Students will take their breakfast to the classroom and eat at their sanitized desk.

Where Will Students Eat

Students will eat in the cafeteria. Current cafeteria tables will be set up to allow for social distancing. Additional seating will be available in the hallway and/or gymnasium to ensure social distancing. When students arrive in the cafeteria they will be directed to sit down immediately at their tables and either wait to be dismissed to get their lunch, or wait for an existing mark on the floor to open up for them to wait in line.

Meal Service

For the students purchasing lunch, there will be two lines with the same meal options. The Third line known as the Marketplace will offer only grab and go cold options. Each line will have one prescribed flow of traffic to the service area, the cashier, and out back into the cafeteria. The lines will be marked to ensure students can social distance while waiting in line. All students must use the sanitation table at the point of entry to the service area. All self-serve stations will be eliminated and all meals will be served to students from a properly trained Nutrition Service staff member. If items are set out for students to grab they will all be packaged, pre-wrapped, or in sealed containers. All condiments packets, and sealed plasticware will be near the cashiers for students to select.

Check Out

On the way out before a student exits the line, they will cleanse their finger with rubbing alcohol wipes and/or sanitizer then scan their finger at the point of sale. Any money that needs to be deposited will be done so online at payschoolscentral.com or given to homeroom teachers at the beginning of the school day. The student will then return directly to their seat to eat their lunch. If a student needs to get up from their seat to reenter the service area, they will need to wait for a designated mark on the floor to become available.

Clean Up

When the lunch period is complete, the students will be dismissed a few tables at a time to dispose of their trash, and return to their classrooms. Cafeteria Proctors will then disinfect each table and chair before the next group comes in.

Breakfast

Grab and Go breakfast stations will be available in the main hallways. There will be a table setup with breakfast bags and milk to choose from. There will be floor markings in the breakfast line to ensure maximum social distancing is being practiced. Students will take their breakfast to the classroom and eat at their sanitized desk.

Where Will Students Eat

Students will eat in the cafeteria. Current cafeteria tables will be set up to allow for social distancing. Additional seating will be available in the hallway or atrium if needed. When students arrive in the cafeteria they will be directed to sit down immediately at their tables and either wait to be dismissed to get their lunch, or wait for an existing mark on the floor to open up for them to wait in line

Meal Service

Each line will have one prescribed flow of traffic to the service area, the cashier, and out back into the cafeteria. The lines will be marked to ensure students can social distance while waiting in line. All students must use the sanitation table at the point of entry to the service area. All self-serve stations will be eliminated and all meals will be served to students from a properly trained Nutrition Service staff member. If items are set out for students to grab they will all be packaged, pre-wrapped, or in sealed containers. All condiments packets, and sealed plasticware will be near the cashiers for students to select.

Check Out

On the way out before a student exits the line, they will cleanse their finger with rubbing alcohol wipes and/or sanitizer then scan their finger at the point of sale. Any money that needs to be deposited will be highly encouraged to do so online at payschoolscentral.com. The student will then return directly to their seat to eat their lunch. If a student needs to get up from their seat to reenter the service area, they will need to wait for a designated mark on the floor to become available.

Clean Up

When the lunch period is complete, the students will be dismissed a few tables at a time to dispose of their trash, and return to their classrooms. Cafeteria Proctors will then disinfect each table and chair before the next group comes in.

Breakfast

Grab and Go breakfast will be available in the serving area. There will be floor markings in the breakfast line to ensure maximum social distancing is being practiced. Students will take their breakfast to the classroom and eat at their sanitized desk.



Remote Learning From Home

The Nutrition Service Department will offer a curbside service every Wednesday from 4-5pm at CS High School. Five breakfast and five lunches will be provided including milk to students who choose online learning. Breakfast and Lunch prices are determined by a completed free/reduced application. There will be a student roster for meal claim purposes. Parents will need to complete the google form order by no later than Thursday 5PM the week prior to pickup. Families can pick up meals for all students in the family at one location in the event there is a student in each building. Students do not automatically qualify for free meals unless qualified by CEP or a meal application.

Nutrition Service Department Policies and Procedures

Arrival to Work, Personal Hygiene and Work Stations

All Nutrition Service Department staff will report to work through the back of the kitchen where hygienic stations will be set up. The station will include a thermometer, alcohol wipe pads, and a recording log. Each staff member will be required to take their temperature and record it before entering the kitchen. Any staff member with a temperature greater than one hundred (100) degrees Fahrenheit, will be asked to return home. Upon entering the kitchen, every staff member will immediately wash their hands and be required to wear gloves when necessary and a face covering. Per department's current glove usage HACCP protocol, all gloves will be changed when a staff member changes tasks. Work stations will be designated in the kitchen to maintain social distance. For jobs that require two staff members we will do our best to maintain a social distance of 6 feet.

Meal Service Areas

All self-service food areas will be out of order for the time being. All food will be distributed to the students by trained nutrition service personnel or delivered to students via a boxed lunch format. If items are set out for students to grab they will all be packaged, pre-wrapped, or in sealed containers. All condiment packets, and sealed plasticware will be included in boxed lunches or near the cashiers for students to select.

Staff Development

Each staff member has recently gone through training to become Level 2 Food Safety Certified, and has completed the ServSafe COVID-19.

Visitors

No visitors or non-kitchen staff personnel will be allowed in the kitchens unless they are there for business purposes only, such as delivery drivers for shipment, or technicians/maintenance team fixing equipment. All approved personnel allowed in the kitchen will be required to enter through the hygienic station, and take their temperature upon entering the kitchen. All approved personnel are required to wear a face covering.

HACCP protocols for our departments are available for each kitchen.



Menu

One four week cycle menu will be created for all grade levels. With the different format of meal service this school year the menu will include less variety, but still provide some options for the students to make a selection. A la carte options will be available to begin the school year except for the elementary. As we progress we will make adjustments to the menu as necessary and will look to either simplify further, or expand variety as the school year progresses. All self-serve stations will be eliminated and all meals will be served to students through a properly trained Nutrition Services staff member. If items are set out for students to grab they will all be packaged, pre-wrapped, or in sealed containers. All condiment packets, and sealed plasticware will be near the cashiers for students to select.

Small group of students is required to self quarantine

If a small outbreak occurs and a few students or a classroom are required to self quarantine they will still be eligible for meal service provided by the district. The Nutrition Services Department will get a notice from the school offices of how many students there are, and the student's names.

Meals will be provided to the students by one of two ways: either a boxed lunch for however many days they are at home, or bulk food items that meet the USDA meal pattern requirements for each day the student will be at home.

Change Policy

One important transition during this school year will be that Child Nutrition will not be providing change or returns for breakfast or lunch cash transactions. Any and all cash that is received from the student will be deposited into their meal account. This is a safety precaution to help reduce touch point transactions at cashier stations.
