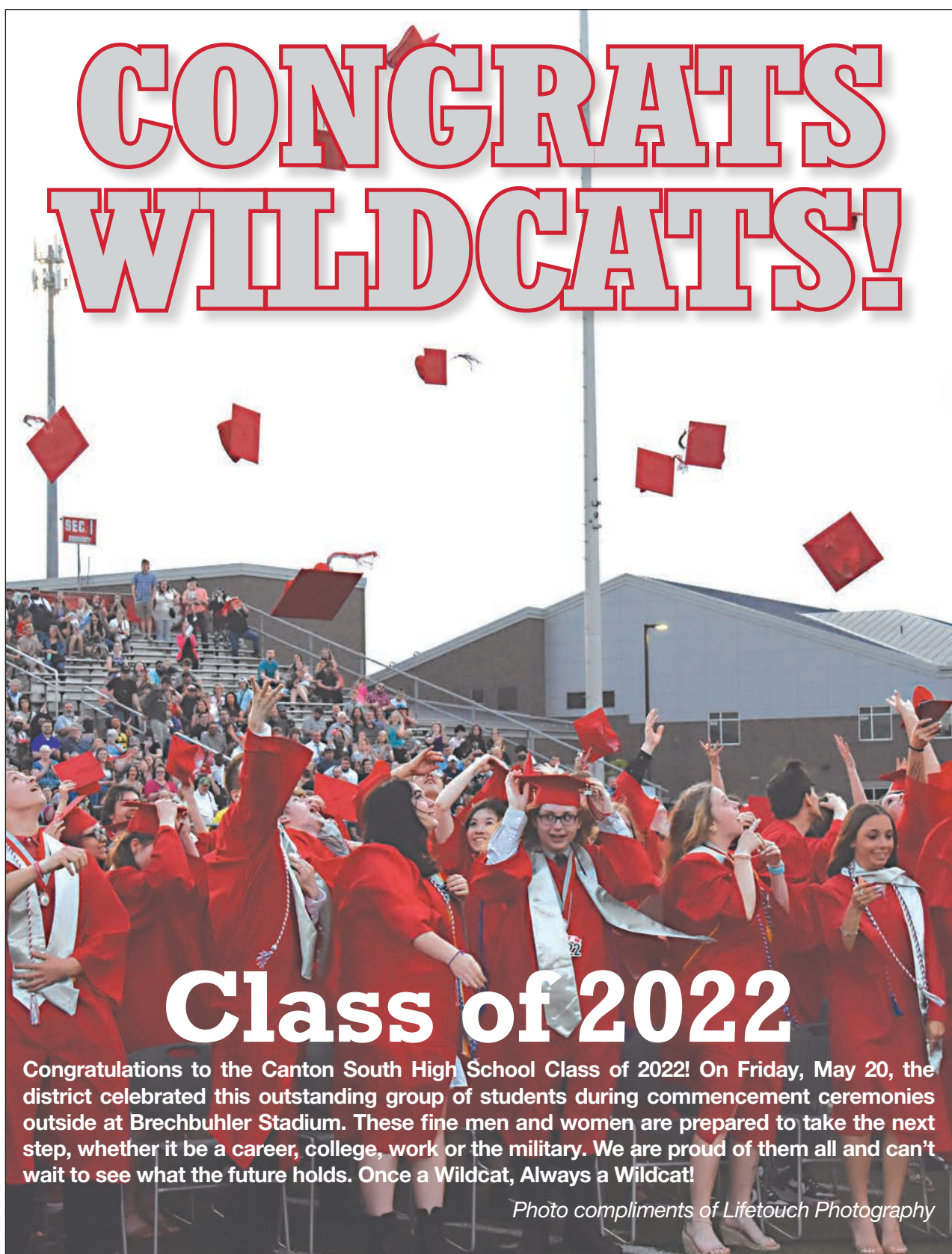

Not only is it an important financial planning tool, but it also offers community members an open and honest review of school district finances and operations. First Day Forms Available

The district is once again using the First Day Forms online system. This process replaces hard copy student registration and permission forms typically sent home on the first day of school.

Holiday Assistance Available

Even though there is still plenty of summer left, it's not too soon to be thinking about the upcoming holidays. Wildcat Preschool

The Canton Local Wildcat Preschool program serves typically developing children and children with special needs who live in the district.

Children who are four years of age by September 30, 2022 may be eligible for free programming based on state income guidelines. All three and four year old children with developmental delays are eligible.

Canton Local Preschool is rated 5 Stars by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. This is the highest rating a preschool can receive. The Canton Local Preschool program includes free breakfast or lunch and transportation to and from preschool.

Class sizes for the 2022-23 school year are limited with most availability for the afternoon class four year old children. We are also accepting applications for the 2023-24 school year. Call 330-484-8022 for more information on qualification and registration.



Summer meals are free to all children ages 1-18



Breakfast and lunch will be served in the Canton South High School cafeteria and must be consumed on campus. Meals are available Monday through Thursday through the end of July, except on observed holidays. Breakfast is served from 8:30 - 9:00 am and lunch from 11:00 -11:30 am. More information and a link to the summer menus are available at cantonlocal.org.

Important changes coming to school meals

Current guidance from USDA does not allow us to serve free meals to all students in the 2022-2023 school year. Elementary and middle students will continue to receive free meals under the community eligibility provision (CEP). Unfortunately, Canton South High School does not qualify for this service. Therefore, students will need to purchase meals from the cafeteria.



More than just free and reduced school lunch

All families are encouraged to fill out online free and reduced meal application for their families. Some people have heard that it is only necessary to fill out this form if you want your child to qualify for free or reduced-price school lunch. The truth is that it is important for EVERY family to fill out this form because doing so helps bring much needed additional money and services to your child's school and to the CLSD.



Important things to know for the upcoming school year

1. Canton South High School families who qualify for free and reduced meals will receive those benefits. A free and reduced meal application is required for direct certification. A new application must be completed after July 1, 2022, for the 2022-2023 school year.
2. The Canton Local Meal Charge Policy will be reenacted.
3. Keep an eye out for our summer mailing with meal prices for Canton South students and other important cafeteria information.
