Immunizations Required

Prior to the start of school, students entering seventh grade are required to have Tdap and Meningitis vaccines and students entering 12th grade are required to have an updated Meningitis vaccine. If your child has received the required vaccinations, and you have not submitted the vaccine record, please submit a copy of their updated immunization record to your child's building. If your child has not received the required vaccines, please call your physician or another provider to obtain the vaccines.

Holiday Assistance Available

Even though there is still plenty of summer left, it's not too soon to be thinking about the upcoming holidays. Wildcat Preschool

The Canton Local Wildcat Preschool program serves typically developing children and children with special needs who live in the district.

Children who are four years of age by September 30, 2022 may be eligible for free programming based on state income guidelines. All three and four year old children with developmental delays are eligible.

Canton Local Preschool is rated 5 Stars by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. This is the highest rating a preschool can receive. The Canton Local Preschool program includes free breakfast or lunch and transportation to and from preschool.

Class sizes for the 2022-23 school year are limited with most availability for the afternoon class of four year old children. We are also accepting applications for the 2023-24 school year. Call 330-484-8022 for more information on qualification and registration.

During the past two years, the school nutrition department has operated under USDA waivers, providing all students nationwide with free meals. Unfortunately, those waivers have expired. The program will revert to previous operations and guidelines established before the pandemic. The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) will go back into effect for Faircrest Memorial Elementary and Canton South Middle Schools, allowing the district to provide meals free of charge to students in grades PreK-8. Unfortunately, Canton South High School does not qualify for CEP.

We have seen tremendous success in our program and are happy to announce that we can provide FREE breakfast to all high schoolers through the universal free breakfast program.

McKinney Sisters Improve Skills at Fine Arts Camp



Below is a summary of the many contributions and accomplishments of the Class of 2022.



Thomas Babik Canton South High School 1969 graduate. Babik attended Bowling Green State University, receiving a Bachelor of Science in Biology and Chemistry. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology and completed graduate work at several universities. Babik served active duty in the US Air Force for two-years and eight years in the reserves.

After a successful career as a healthcare executive with several major medical groups, Babik retired in 2017 and is currently a healthcare consultant, providing services to physicians, group practices and healthcare systems. His commitment to giving back to his community is evident in the list of volunteer organizations he has served. In 2002, he was chosen by the citizens of Bowling Green to represent them as their Winter Olympics Torchbearer.



Lee J. Bowman Canton South Marching Band Director 1967 – 2001. Bowman earned a bachelor's degree in music from Bowling Green State University in 1966 and a Master of Science in education from the University of Daytonin 1985. A beloved teacher, Bowman distinguished himself by being a dedicated professional, developer of students and innovator. Under his leadership, Canton

South's band became a source of pride for the school and community. Bowman grew the band boosters into a strong organization that provided uniforms and equipment for students and financed numerous band trips. In addition, his bands were invited to perform at events such as the grand opening of Macy's in NYC, the Cherry Blossom Festival in Washington, DC and countless other community events and parades.



Clyde Brechbuhler Canton Township (South) High School 1939 graduate. Brechbuhler served during World War II in the Army Air Corps as a radio operator, navigator and gunner and attended cadet training while in the military. He was the retired owner/operator of Brechbuhler Scales Inc. and their subsidiaries, serving as chairman of the board until his passing on Friday,

January 23, 2015. Mr. Brechbuhler was a member of the Canton Local Board of Education from 1958-1965 during which time the long term vision for the district was established. Mr. Brechbuhler was a key contributor to the Canton Local school and community through his time, talents and resources. In 2002 through the generous donations of the Brechbuhler family, the CSHS stadium was renovated and the stadium was named in his honor. In 2017, Canton Local Schools named its new stadium in his honor, as well.



Dr. Martha Cook Canton South guidance counselor from 1962-1980, Dr. Martha J. Cook has been an educator for over fifty-five years. She earned her bachelor's degree and teaching license from the Ohio State University, master's degree and licensure in counseling from Kent State University, and a doctorate in education. She was named Teacher of the Year at Sandy Valley High

School in 1958. During her tenure at Canton South, Dr. Cook earned the Ohio Outstanding Counselor of the Year and Ohio School Counselor's Research Award. Dr. Cook's book, Grammar Toward Professionalism, has impacted leaders in industry and business across the nation to improve their speaking and writing skills. Dr. Cook is a professor-emeriti at Malone University, author and 20-year Senior Olympic champion.



Howard Jolliff Canton South High School 1956 graduate and CSHS principal from 1973-1993. Under the leadership of legendary coach Red Ash, Jolliff led the Wildcats to an unbeaten regular season in 1955-56 by scoring 21.5 points per game. An outstanding scorer and rebounder for the Ohio University Bobcats, he played two years of varsity basketball at Ohio University.

After his junior year, Jolliff was drafted by the Los Angeles Lakers and became the first Bobcat to play in the National Basketball Association. He coached basketball and golf for two years at Ravenna and Jackson high schools. His Ravenna golf team won the 1966 state championship. Mr. Jolliff returned to Canton South High School to serve as principal and positively impacted students, staff and the community for 25 years. In 2013, he was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame.



Melvin Lenzy Canton South High School 1991 graduate. Lenzy played numerous sports at Canton South, including basketball, baseball and track. He earned his bachelor's degree from Purdue University and a Masters in Sports Management from Xavier (OH) in 1996. Lenzy's successful career as a marketing executive included positions with the Portland Trail Blazers, Portland Power

Women's Professional Basketball league, the University of Akron, EA Sports and the NFL. He joined NIKE in 2004, launching major footwear initiatives around the world and working with athletes such as Kobe Bryant, LeBron James, and Colin Kaepernick. Throughout his career, Mr. Lenzy has demonstrated a continued interest in the future of young Wildcats by donating shoes for entire Wildcat teams, providing items for fundraisers and serving as a speaker for our youth. He is currently the Senior Director, Head of Global Marketing Strategy for NBA2K.






NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL

The new Canton South Middle School, located at 4404 Cleveland Avenue, South, will serve approximately 450 students in grades 6-8 and shares the same site as the existing high school to create a middle/high school campus.

The floor plan reflects 21st Century Learning in which the layout of spaces supports flexibility of use and various learning experiences that will help students form the skills needed in the workforce. The exterior design borrows the overall theme, colors, and materials from Canton South High School to help create a campus identity, yet still looks like its own building and design. Eighth graders will occupy the first floor, and sixth and seventh graders will occupy the second floor at their respective ends of the building. The north portion of the building houses the administration offices, band and choir rooms, student dining, media center and gymnasium.

The District funded the project with savings from public utility tax revenue over the past several years, along with a partnership with the Ohio **Facilities Construction Commission**


Clever: The building features state-ofthe-art technology including Clever Touch Plus interactive display boards in each of the common areas for hand-on advanced teaching and learning experiences.
