Construction Begins on New Canton South Middle School

Monday, September 14, 2020, officially marked the start of the Canton South Middle School building project with a groundbreaking celebration. Construction on the building will begin in the fall of 2020 and be completed in May 2022.

The new Canton South Middle School will serve approximately 450 students in grades 6-8 and shares the same site as the existing high school to create a middle/high school campus. The building's elongated North-South shape allows it to fit within the constraints of the site while keeping district operations intact.

The floor plan reflects 21st Century Learning in which the layout of spaces not only supports flexibility of use, but various learning experiences that will help students form the skills needed in the 21st century workforce.

The exterior design borrows overall theme, colors, and materials from the existing high school to help create a campus identity, yet still looks like its own building and design. Funding for the project comes from public utility taxes that the district has been able to put aside over the past several years, along with a partnership with the Ohio Schools Facilities Commission. GPD group is the project architect/engineer and Beaver Constructors, construction managers.

Free Breakfast and Lunch for All Students

The USDA has extended its Summer Food Service Program through June 30, 2021. This means that breakfast and lunch meals will be free for all students in grades Pre-kindergarten through 12.

Per the USDA and federal food service programs, this includes complete meals only. Individual items will be charged accordingly. For example: If a student chooses to buy only milk (or extra milk), it will cost fifty cents. However, if a student orders a full meal that includes milk, the meal is at no cost to the student.

Parents still MUST complete free and reduced lunch applications for all eligible students for the 2020-21 school year. Applications are available online at payschoolscentral.com.

Canton Local Virtual Academy families may order and pick up meal bundles that include five breakfasts and five lunches at no cost each week school is in session. Pickup day is Wednesday from 4-4:30 pm in front of Canton South High School door #2. **Virtual academy parents must sign up for this service online weekly** by Sunday. Answers to Most Frequently Asked Questions about the May 2021 Levy

What will the renewal levy cost taxpayers?

The renewal levy is NOT a New Tax and will not increase taxes.

What is a renewal levy?

Ohio law allows districts to ask voters to renew a limited levy when it expires. The levy must be for the same purpose and is renewed at the current millage rate. Canton Local's renewal request is for 8.9 mils for operations and 1.9 for permanent improvements for a 5-year term. The expiring levies were last renewed in 2016.

What is included in operating dollars?

Operating levy funds are used by the district to pay staff to educate, feed, counsel, support and transport students as well as implement improvements in safety and security, mental health, academics programming, arts and extra-curriculars.

What is included in permanent improvement dollars?

Permanent improvement levy funds are used to help pay for buses, technology, maintenance equipment and building improvements.

Does the district have a levy on the ballot because of the new middle school?

The renewal is needed regardless of the new construction project. The new middle school is being funded in partnership with the Ohio Schools Facilities Commission along with public utility taxes that the district set aside over the past several years.

What is the district doing to reduce costs and operate efficiently?

The district:

- Maintains staffing levels to meet student needs and enrollment projections
- Utilizes business and community partnerships to fund special projects
- Applies for state and federal grant opportunities
- Monitors interest rates and refinances bonds saving taxpayers nearly \$2 million since 2014




Based on guidelines from Governor DeWine, the **Ohio Department** of Education and the Stark County Health Department, Canton Local Schools offered parents the choice of two learning options for the 2020-2021 school vear: traditional in-school format,

with appropriate safety measures, five days per week and an online learning option through the Canton Local Virtual Academy (CLVA) utilizing the Edgenuity Educational platform.

The District strongly believes that the traditional school format is the best learning model for most students and implemented additional safety procedures and protocols to provide the safest learning environment possible. They are also pleased to offer an online learning option through the CLVA, with support from Canton Local teachers, to families and students who cannot or choose not to return to the traditional school format.



Students are assigned weekly academic work through the Edgenuity system. Lessons are delivered via computer, giving students the opportunity to learn from videos, computer activities, and traditional written work and projects. Canton Local support teachers set up the weekly academic work while monitoring student progress and providing feedback on assignments.

The CLVA features two "schools" for students in K-5 and 6-12. Parents have the option of changing the way in which their child is learning at the end of each nine weeks. Currently there are 21.34% enrolled in the CLVA for second semester which began October 26.

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



Students Take In-School Field Trips








Holiday Play Staged as Live Radio Show

Brady Noll finished second place at the EBC Cross Country Meet and placed 7th at districts, qualifying him for regional competition on Saturday, October 31.




Golf


