### **Wildcat Preschool Available**

The Wildcat Preschool program serves children who live in the Canton Local District. All three and four-year-old children with and without developmental delays are eligible, with enrollment priority given to four-year-old children and those with identified disabilities. Tuition is based on income eligibility and is often at no cost to parents.

Wildcat Preschool is rated 5-Stars by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. This is the highest rating a preschool can receive.

The preschool program includes free breakfast, lunch, and transportation to and from Walker Elementary School. Class sizes are limited. Call 330-484-8022 for more information on qualification and registration.

### Vaccination Requirements

Prior to the start of school, students entering seventh grade are required to have Tdap and Meningitis vaccines and students entering 12th grade are required to have an updated Meningitis vaccine. If your child has received the required vaccinations, and you have not submitted the vaccine record, please submit a copy of their updated immunization record to your child's building. If your child has not received the required vaccines, please call your physician or another provider to obtain the vaccines.

### **Student Pick Up Route**

- 1 As cars turn onto Oyer St. SE they will enter the school parking lot closest to Sandy Ave. SE.
- 2 As cars enter the parking lot, please make sure the child's pick-up identification number card is visible. A staff member will enter that number into our pick-up system to prepare the child for dismissal. If a vehicle does not have an identification card, they may be asked to verify their identity with a valid driver's license. After the number has been entered, each vehicle will be directed into either of the two lines within the parking lot. Both lines move at the same pace.
- 3 Vehicles will stay in their lane until they are in the loading zone, where the child will be released to their vehicle. Four to five vehicles are loaded at a time and rows alternate. A staff member will be directing traffic in the loading zone.
- 4 To improve timeliness, drivers are asked to stay in their vehicles and NOT buckle their child within the loading zone. Please drive the vehicle to the Buckle Zone and buckle the child safely into the vehicle.



Student dismissal will begin at 2:45 p.m. Vehicles are not permitted on school grounds for dismissal until 2:00 p.m.

### Student Drop Off Route


- 1 Cars will enter the parking lot in a single line at the main entrance of the school.
- 2 Cars will make a right turn towards the side of the building.
- 3 Following our staff member directions, approximately 3-4 cars will unload at a time in the unloading zone.
- 4 Once those cars have unloaded and students are in a safe area, these cars will move towards the exit and a new set of cars will move into the unloading zone.



Please stay in your vehicle at all times, have your child ready to unload and drive slowly through the parking lot.

Drop off starts at 7:50 a.m. Students will wait in the gym until they are released to their classrooms at 8:20 a.m.





## Positive Behavior Program Implemented at Walker

Per the State of Ohio, all schools are to implement PBIS – Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. Walker will be fully implementing this system to promote positive behavior which should enable your child to be more successful. The focus is on positive feedback and clear expectations. Staff and students will be following the School Matrix that clearly define behavioral expectations in a variety of settings.

Students who "ROAR" will be celebrated. Positive incentives will include stickers, buttons, and recognition during PBIS gatherings.

Our two counselors will be planning classroom lessons that will have a monthly focus to support our students and help them be more successful. Using the Zones of Regulation program, students will be able to learn techniques that will help them understand and control their emotions.

### Faircrest Begins Transformation To Elementary School

Many projects are underway this summer at Faircrest Memorial Middle School as the district works to transition the building to an elementary school in August 2022. The upgraded facility will house students in preschool to fifth grade.

The initiative is part of the larger construction project that includes the new Canton South Middle School being constructed on Rt. 800. Funding for the project comes from public utility taxes that the district has been able to put aside over the past several years, along with a partnership with the Ohio Schools Facilities Commission.

These two opening will lead to the new boys and girls bathrooms on the second floor.




Canton Local received a grant last year from GPD Group, architects of the new middle school. The grant provided funds for new whiteboards in the classrooms.


Joining the inaugural class of Charles "Red" Ash, Sharon Lane, Louis "Lou" Mikunda and Dr. Walker are:



Jim Abbott: A journeyman electrician, Mr. Abbott founded Abbott Electric in 1978. He and his wife have lived in Canton South for over 50 years and, along with their family, are tireless volunteers and generous supporters of the Canton Local School District and community. In 1985, Mr. Abbott and Ralph Martinelli established the Wildcat fund, preserving athletic programs and offerings for students during a difficult financial time.



Barbara (Ferren) Cush: Canton South 1953 graduate. Mrs. Cush served as secretary to the principal and guidance department at Canton South High School and Walker Elementary School.





William Hayden: Canton South 1946 graduate. Mr. Hayden was a Korean War veteran serving as a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. He started his teaching career in Canton Local in 1955 becoming a principal in 1959. He was named superintendent in 1964, a position he held for 23 years. Mr. Hayden was honored as "Ohio Superintendent of the Year" in 1978. The Hayden Career Technical Annex was dedicated in his honor.



Dr. Rosemary Johnson: Trump Elementary school principal from 1980-1984. Dr. Johnson was named superintendent in 1986, becoming the first female superintendent of Canton Local and in Stark County. Dr. Johnson was a highly respected educator and strong advocate for students of all abilities.



Dr. David King: Canton South 1979 graduate. Dr. King graduated with honors with a Doctor of Optometry Degree from The Ohio State University. He opened King Eye Center in 1987 in China Grove, North Carolina. Dr. King has volunteered for decades providing free eye care to those in need through community clinics, at state prisons and through mission trips to Guatemala. Dr. King has also displayed a strong commitment to the growth and development of his local community through his service to the local board of health and other organizations aimed at helping under served populations.



McDannel: Amos McDannel, served Amos as a teacher and principal in the Canton Local School District for 48 years. In 1955 the district named an elementary school in his honor. Mr. McDannel was recognized for his loyalty to his fellow man and God, which was exemplified by his concern and compassion for children.



Ida McDannel: Known as the "first lady of Canton Local Schools." Mrs. McDannel shared her husband's passion for education, serving on PTAs and planning events for children and families. The beloved couple made it their life-long practice to help young people obtain an education and become successful in their chosen careers.
